

PROPULSION INSTRUMENTATION WORKING GROUP (PIWG)

PIWG was formed in 1995 to address critical turbine engine test cell instrumentation, sensors and measurement technology to keep pace with the needs of the turbine engine and gas turbine power generation communities. PIWG encourages commercial sources to develop advanced test cell instrumentation required by the gas turbine engine industry and works cooperatively with other similar groups in the US and abroad.

PIWG focuses on:

- Identifying common sensor and measurement needs and requirements;
- Creating and implementing a common strategy and vision to guide future research and development;
- Providing a consensus voice to represent the gas turbine test cell instrumentation industry; and
- Identifying and pursuing instrumentation development efforts.
